To achieve safety, equity, and liberation for all Black lives, we attend to systems and networks of care to make the domination, erasure, and dehumanization of Black life obsolete.

Our People

Steering Committee

We are Black teachers, parents, organizers, community activists, students, and artists. We are located across eight regions in ten states. This year we raised our concerns in articles addressing classroom censorship, explaining critical race theory, and naming our solidarity with LGBTQIA+ students. We laid out approaches to the work in books focused on child care justice, social studies education, and our history of resistance. We continue to speak out in interviews, on panels, and as keynotes. We are dedicated to local work, elevating the four national demands, and struggling for global liberation. We choose not to be bound by the inequities in the present. Instead, we use our imagination to dream, make plans to change the world, and adamantly pursue freedom.

Partner Organizations

We are committed to transformative education, equitable schools, and working alongside organizations with aligned values. In 2022, we fought beside the Zinn Education Project, African American Policy Forum, Journey for Justice Alliance, Coalition for Liberated Ethnic Studies, and Communities for Just Schools Fund. We participated in Critical Race Theory Summer School, the Equity or Else [campaign](#), Teach Truth's Day of Action, and the Teaching for Black Lives Study Group. We'll continue our national partnerships while striving to unite with regional groups, local associations, and schools supporting students of all ages.

Key Updates:

We are accountable to our network, which includes youth, educators, parents, families, local community advocates, diligent supporters, and bold people who regularly participate in our programming and use our shared resources.

Week of Action: People took action in their classrooms, school districts, and on college campuses. They invited others to participate by attending community panels, movie screenings, youth showcases, and curriculum fairs. Some participated in a social media campaign or coordinated silent acts of solidarity.

Year of Purpose: We continue to ask people to self-reflect, and we, as a committee, are doing the same. As an outcome of reflection and internal talks, we expanded upon "Justice for George" Day. It has become ABOLITION DAY as a tribute to the continuing legacy of Black-led abolitionist organizing, which has incited justice-oriented transformations in our world.

Committees

Curriculum: This committee helps curate resources and materials that span grades and subject areas to support educators in preparation for the week of action. In addition, they organize the year of purpose information and activities.

Communications, Outreach, & Partnerships: This committee promotes our message and builds cross-issue coalitions. They will connect us to spaces that center young Black people, educators, and community. Expanding the list of organizations, associations, and groups who share our goals.

Programs: This committee organizes, coordinates, and facilitates events about the four demands, thirteen principles, and proving Black lives matter at school. Our programming includes webinars, panel discussions, book studies, and more.

Policy: This committee supports students and educators facing education bans and other harmful legislation. They will identify, curate, and develop tools aligned with our principles. Providing ways to engage in policy at different levels.

Membership & Recruitment: This committee creates a space to showcase our network's organizing work. They will build on the collective knowledge of our members, real experiences, and strategies. Seek to build, provide, and nurture spaces for educators to be together.
